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PRESIDENT'S LETTER by Associate Professor Marinis Pirpiris

The Hellenic Medical Society of Australia (HMSA) has had an impactful and dynamic 2024, marked by significant contributions to healthcare, education, and community development. Some of our key highlights included:



Cultural and Professional Events: HMSA organized several high-profile events promoting health education and professional networking, fostering collaboration among healthcare professionals of Hellenic heritage. One of the highlights was the visit of Kostas Vlasis, Representative of Arcadia in the Hellenic Parliament and former Deputy Foreign Minister. He was a part of a Greek parliamentary delegation that paid visits to the Australian Hellenic War Memorial, the Archdiocese of Australia, and the Pan Arcadians and also participated in the National Day Parade. It was wonderful to meet with Hellenic parliamentarians Mr Vlasis, Asimina Skondra, Theodora Tzakri and Evangelia Liakouli and discuss issues relating to the health and welfare of the diaspora and the opportunities for closer clinical and academic collaborations between Australia and Greece.

Community Outreach: Through targeted health initiatives, the Society addressed pressing health issues within the Greek-Australian community, including chronic disease prevention, mental health awareness, and culturally tailored healthcare access. It was wonderful to meet with the Prime Minister and members of his Cabinet in March and discuss issues affecting the welfare and well-being of patients affected by chronic diseases. I was privileged to meet with Clare O'Neil MP and Steve Georganas MP and discuss the crucial contributions of doctors of Hellenic descent to the welfare of culturally and linguistically diverse communities.

Mentorship and Education: The Society continued its commitment to supporting emerging healthcare professionals by providing mentorship programs, scholarships, and academic workshops, bridging the gap between traditional and modern medical practices. Seeing the support and engagement with the next generation of young friends and future leaders who attended the HMSA Careers Day at the Greek Community of Melbourne was terrific. The Careers Day was an engaging event that included talks, questions and answer sessions and one-on-one conversations between some of Victoria's leading academics and business leaders and secondary school students with Hellenic backgrounds from across the State of Victoria. I would like to thank Mr Bill Papastergiadis OAM, and the Board of the Greek Community for their support of this event. I would also like to thank Dr Athina Pirpiris, HMSA Board member for her tireless commitment to making this day and great event.

Collaborations and Partnerships: Strengthened relationships with other cultural and medical organizations to enhance global health dialogues and community engagement. It was our pleasure to host Professor John Chrysoulakis, President of AHEPA and former Secretary General for Greeks Abroad of the Hellenic Parliament and discuss the development of strategic partnerships with Hellenic Universities. I was also honoured to meet with several Greek politicians and academics including Mr Kostantinos Tasoulas, President of the Hellenic Parliament, Adonis Georgiadis, Minister of Health in Greece, Giorgios Kotsiras Deputy Foreign Minister and Former Minister of Justice for International Cooperation and Human Rights in Greece, Professor Gerasimos Siasos Rector of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, Professor Sophia Papaioannou Vice Rector for Academic Affairs of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens and Professor Nikolaos Arkadopoulos, Dean of the School of Medicine at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens to discuss the legislative and regulatory changes required to grow academic and clinical collaborations between Greece and Australia.

Sustainability in Healthcare: Advocated for environmentally sustainable practices in medicine, reflecting HMSA's dedication to responsible and forward-thinking healthcare delivery. We were blessed to have a visit by the Head of the Patriarchate of Constantinople and of the Holy Synod, Archbishop of Constantinople, New Rome and Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew. On behalf of the HMSA, I was privileged to be an organiser of an excellent reception at Government House. It was a delightful evening with speeches by the Governor of Victoria, Her Excellency Professor the Honourable Margaret Gardner AC, the Premier of Victoria, Ms Jacinta Allen MP and the Ecumenical Patriarch. Hearing his commitment to justice, social welfare, and sustainability was inspiring. It was also a privilege to discuss the importance of sustainability in healthcare with the Patriarch and Archbishop Makarios of Australia.

The Society remains committed to integrating Hellenic values of philanthropy, community spirit, and excellence into its mission of advancing healthcare for all.

The HMSA held its Annual General Meeting on Tuesday 23rd April at the Greek Community of Melbourne. The HMSA welcomes its newest Board members Dr Athina Pirpiris. Dr Con Giannellis and Professor Dennis Velakoulis. The night was followed by a talk on Medicinal Cannabis presented by Professor Vicki Kotsirilos.

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

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OXI DAY - AUSTRALIAN HELLENIC MEMORIAL

OCT 24

On October 28, 2024, the Hellenic R.S.L. Sub Branch held the OXI Day commemorative ceremony at the Australian Hellenic Memorial and the Shrine of Remembrance to honor this significant event in world history. On behalf of the president of the Hellenic Medical Society of Australia Associate Professor Marinis Pirpiris, Dr Benjamin Filipopoulos, proudly attended and laid a wreath. The ceremony was attended by key representatives of the Greek community, including Consul General Mr. Emmanuel Kakavelakis, Greek Community of Melbourne President Mr. Bill Papastergiadis OAM, and students from Alphington and Oakleigh Grammar Schools. Also in attendance was Grace Bishop Kyriakos of Sozopolis.

This important occasion marks the day when the Greek prime minister, Ioannis Metaxas, rejected an ultimatum given by dictator Benito Mussolini during World War II to allow Italian troops to

cross the border into Greece and occupy strategic sites within Greek territory. The Greek forces held back the Italian and subsequent Axis forces for approximately six months. Greece suffered a total of 300,000 to 800,000 civilian and military deaths during the second World War.





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HMSA MENTORING PROGRAM

Introducing the HMSA Mentoring Program.

The HMSA is pleased to announce the introduction of a mentoring program starting from February 2025. Mentoring has traditionally been an integral component of learning and development across all professions in particular medicine. Furthermore, it can challenge current perceptions and provoke new and innovative ways of thinking.

The minimum requirement would involve meeting with your mentee three times a year either in person (eg over a coffee or at an HMSA event) or over the phone/virtually.

There has been an expressed desire from medical students and junior doctors to engage with more experienced members of the medical community in order to seek advice and discuss options regarding specialisation, hospital rotations, work-life balance as well as research and further study opportunities.
